## Special Session: The Kigali Declaration by Working Children and Youth

In January 2023, 63 working children from 16 countries of four continents came together in Kigali, Rwanda, for the first Global Gathering of Working Children and Youth. It was organised as part of the global campaign "Dialogue Works" (DW) which seeks to sustainably anchor working children's participation in societal and political processes on all levels (initiated by *Kindernothilfe* and *Terre des Hommes*).

Most of the participants to the Global Gathering are members of the different *Children's Advisory Committees* (CAC) that constitute a vital part of the DW project. They were joined by representatives of working children's movements from Latin America and Afrika. Together, they spent a week exchanging experiences, learning from one another, building capacities and sharing key messages on crosscutting issues affecting the lives of working children and youth. In addition, a special working group drafted the <u>Kigali Declaration</u>, in which they present their suggestions and demands for policy-making and practice from local to global level. It was adopted unanimously by all participants at the end of the week.

For this Special Session, we have invited 6 of the child and youth delegates (see below) to present the main demands of the Kigali Declaration:

- 1) Address poverty, provide decent jobs for our parents and ensure our basic needs are met;
- 2) Take our education seriously and provide quality education and skill training;
- 3) Protect us from labour exploitation, harsh conditions and risks, and allow children to do suitable dignified work;
- 4) Listen to us, understand us and implement laws that respect our rights;
- 5) Prevent and protect working children from violence and discrimination;
- 6) Climate Justice.

The session will be held in English and Spanish (with interpretation).

## **Presenters:**

**Esmeralda**: 16 years, from Peru. I work in agriculture and raise small animals. I am from the Andean culture. I like to play volleyball. I like ancient and classical music, art and painting. I like to give my opinion, to debate and share new ideas and do social projects. I contribute to the social organisation of children and adolescents and to promoting the right to work in dignity. CAC representative, supported by DW partner organisations *Instituto de Formación para Educadores de Jóvenes, Adolescentes y Niños, Niñas Trabajadores de América Latina y el Caribe* (IFEJANT) and *Movimiento Nacional de Niños, Niñas y Adolescentes Trabajadores Organizados del Perú* (MNNATSOP).

**Phyenele**: 17 years, from Kenya. A child rights activist (any decisions made for us without us is working against us) and student who loves playing basketball. CAC representative, supported by DW partner organisation *Welfare for Children and Youth* (WCY).

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**Sheyla**: 15 years, from Peru. CAC representative, supported by DW partner organisation *Centro de Estudios Sociales e Publicaciones* (CESIP).

**Reimond**: 15 years from Peru. Works in housing construction. He likes to play volleyball. He believes in a change in society until working children live in good conditions of dignity and respect, without exploitation or mistreatment. CAC representative, supported by DW partner organisation IFEJANT and *Programa de Microfinanzas cogestionada para los niños, niñas y adolescentes trabajadores* (PROMINNATs).

**Margaret**: 21 years, from Kenya. Former child labourer and currently facilitator for/coordinator of the Dialogue Works CAC supported by DW partner organisation *Action for Children in Conflict* (AfCiC).
